#### Feedback Obtained

At the end of each semester feedback are collected from each student and it is analyzed. The Balurghat B.Ed. College has well equipped classrooms for different mediums of instructions like English, Bengali and Sanskrit. We have different rooms for each method like English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Geography, Political Science, Physics, Life Science, Mathematics, Computer Science and Application. Classrooms are fully ventilated and well lighted. It has physical facilities like fans, tube lights and good sitting arrangements. The institution has appointed an electrician to look after the electronic facilities. For white board maintenance the concerned company is in contact with the institution. The institution is contacting the company whenever necessary. The institution has appointed computer engineers to look after the functions of computers and Wi-Fi systems. Different labs like Language labs and science labs are well furnished. The institution has a Science Laboratory and Psychology Laboratory. The Science Laboratory has models and apparatus. List of apparatus is maintained. There are several charts, tracing table etc for facilitating learning. Library has ample space for readers. It is well equipped with tables, chairs, and computers. There are other materials like Journals, newspapers, magazines etc. The college has provided the sports equipment for both the indoor and outdoor games.
