Profile of the Balurghat B.Ed. College (Autonomous)

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The college was envisioned by a team of distinguished persons, sons of the soil and founding leaders, who are eminent educationists and experienced educational administrators with wide knowledge of the education system in India. Deeply concerned about the quality of teacher education and school education, they dreamed of establishing a college of teacher education in Dakshin Dinajpur district. With active support from the Balurghat Educational Promotion and Welfare Trust, along with local educationists, leaders, and social reformers, this dream became a reality in 2004. Since then, the college has earned a commendable reputation in India as an institution of excellence in teacher education.

MISSION AND VISION OF THE COLLEGE

The mission of the college is to impart quality teacher education to both pre-service and in-service teachers from Dakshin Dinajpur district and across North Bengal. It aims to equip them to play meaningful and effective roles in the classroom and to make committed teachers who can provide quality education to students. It also includes its commitment to achievement of excellence in world class teacher education.

The vision of the founding team is to ensure quality teacher education and training that enables our trainees to nurture competent learners and contribute to national development across all domains. The college also strives to prepare its students to become responsible members of society and dutiful citizens of India.

STATUS OF THE COLLEGE

The college is a non-profit, unaided, self-financed institution for teacher education and training. It is managed and maintained by the Balurghat Educational Promotion and Welfare Trust.

Affiliation Status

Established on July 7, 2004, the college is duly recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education, Government of India, and approved by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. It was initially affiliated to the

University of North Bengal. In April 2009, it came under the affiliating jurisdiction of the University of Gour Banga, Malda, and was granted permanent affiliation.

Since February 1, 2017, the college has been affiliated to The West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning and Administration, now renamed Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University, 25/2 & 25/3, Ballygunge Circular Road, Kolkata – 700019.

UGC Status and NAAC Accreditation

The college is included under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. It has been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), India, since 2009 and presently accredited by the NAAC with Grade "B"

Methodology of Audit

The inputs received from the different departments and sections and the related outputs have been examined and validated on the basis of the supporting documents provided by the college, as well as on the basis of interactions with the Principal, IQAC Coordinator, faculty members and Superintendent and support staff of the office and visit to the college.

Observations

a) Curricular Aspects

Balurghat B.Ed. College is presently affiliated to Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University, Kolkata. The College follows the curriculum framed and introduced by the said University. It encompasses all the processes of the college such as, the student section, Administrative, Academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for effective teaching and learning. The college is found encouraging students self-study and faculties and students to join various online academic programs for quality enhancement. For effective delivery of curriculum, the sections (M.Ed. and B.Ed.) are maintaining lesson plans and course progress records duly monitored and advised by the Principal. The sections follow the academic calendar of affiliating university. It was observed that the college conducted Add-on Certificate courses, outreach activities, faculty development programmes and non-teaching training programmes during the assessment period. MoUs with institutions both at the State and National Level have been signed and executed to achieve the goals of the curriculum. Special classes were held during this academic period not only for slow learners but for the achievement of the goals of the curriculum, that is, to fully empower the students with the necessary knowledge, techniques and methods of effective classroom teaching.

b) Teaching learning aspects

Assessment of learning levels to identify slow and advanced learners is carried out through examination, seminars, and assignments. Though the College follows students' centric learning method for effective curriculum delivery, a detailed unit-wise plan for experiential and participative learning is satisfactorily maintained for enhancing the learning experiences of the students and improving their intrinsic quality as effective teachers in the society. The College maintains a mentoring system. But documentation of the mentoring system is quite adequate. All the departments related with the conduct internal

examinations as per the requirement of the affiliating University were examined and found adequate and satisfactory. The College has already deliberated on the more effective teaching learning modes and methods and incorporated different modes for continuous internal evaluation. Program Outcomes, Program Specific Outcomes, and Course Outcomes are described in the syllabus. Evaluation of the attainment of the learning outcomes is found to have been done in a proper way.

c) Research, Innovation, and Extension

The college has recently launched a drive for the faculty members to undertake research activities. This programme was successfully organized and held in the college as per documents submitted to the auditors who have examined those. The interactions with the faculty members of the college revealed their satisfaction over the series of programmes held for their development in the domains of knowledge and education.

The faculties have developed keen interest in undertaking research activities that include field visit for data collection, research reporting and research paper writing and publication. The initiative of the M.Ed. Section to hold departmental seminars on research methodology and research deserves appreciation.

However, the overall research culture in the College needs to be further strengthened. The two sections of the college are conducting very effective extension activities directed toward development in the field of promotion of education, creation of social consciousness, political awareness regarding natural, legal and constitutional rights and duties and also values of democracy. The involvement of the students in those activities is quite satisfactory.

d) Infrastructure

The College has adequate infrastructure facilities for all academic and other extracurricular activities. The college library is adequately enriched with digital library facility and is found to be serving the purposes of students and faculty members not only for course-based leaning support but advanced studies as well. The indoor and outdoor play area is adequate, well-planned and highly motivating. There is commendable facility for yoga education and training for students.

e) Student Support and Progression

Several Departments conduct capacity-building and skill enhancement activities for the students in order to empower them. The placement of the students and progression to higher education is encouraging. Students are encouraged for participation in extra-curricular activities in various ways as found and reported by the Principal of the college.

f) Professional Development Activities

Teachers have participated in FDP and the college provides necessary support to teachers to participate in faculty development as well as professional programmes. The college provides for the assessment and evaluation of all faculty and professional development activities. More emphasis needs to be laid on the activities to further improve work culture.

- Employment opportunity programmes through various authorized organizations.



Challenges
